



Message from the Headmaster

Dear Andrean Community

The Easter Term has drawn to a close after a very busy and successful term. The rowers have packed away their blades and the winter sports season, which traditionally begins after the weekend of the South African Schools Rowing Championships at Roodeplaas, is well under way. The summer term is quite often disrupted by many different sporting codes and many boys going on various festivals, rowing champs, cricket, waterpolo and basketball tournaments etc. The school is a much more cohesive and united unit in winter with the two main sports of rugby and hockey that attract a

faithful following and involve 90% of the school.

Our relatively inexperienced 1st XV captained by veteran prop, Robin Murray, has had a baptism of fire having faced two of the top traditional rugby playing schools in the country in two of their three matches so far. SA MATHEMATICS OLYMPIAD RESULTS

85 Junior boys and 100 Senior boys wrote the first round of the Olympiad last Wednesday. This is approximately 40% of the school.

55 Senior boys and 51 Junior boys achieved the 50% which qualifies them to go through to the second round.

Typically around 60 000 pupils write countrywide every year and of those only about 10 000 make it into round two; about 16%. St Andrew's College achieved 101 out of 185 through; 55% of the boys. A really excellent result – well done to those boys and their teachers for a superb effort.
